Request for Order to Get a Copy of a Death Certificate

Checklist

You may use the forms and instructions in this packet only if the following factors apply to your situation:

- ✓ The person whose death certificate you need died in Yuma County; AND
- ✓ You are not a person eligible to receive a copy of a death certificate without a court order*; AND/OR
- ✓ Yuma County Vital Records has told you that you need a court order to get a copy of the death certificate.

*The following people or entities are eligible to receive a copy without a court order. See Arizona Administrative Code R9-19-314:

1. A funeral director representing one of the following in a final disposition of the deceased individual's human remains, within 12 months after the registration of the deceased individual's death:
 - a. The deceased individual through a prearranged funeral agreement, as defined in A.R.S. § 32-1301;
 - b. The deceased individual's spouse;
 - c. The deceased individual's parent, grandparent, or adult child, grandchild, brother, or sister; or
 - d. Another person who is responsible for the final disposition of the deceased individual's human remains according to A.R.S. § 36-831;
2. A designee of a funeral director in subsection (B)(1);
3. The surviving spouse of the deceased individual;
4. A parent or grandparent of the deceased individual;
5. An adult child, grandchild, brother, or sister of the deceased individual;
6. A person designated in a power of attorney, established by a person eligible according to subsection (B)(3), (4), or (5);

7. Another person who is responsible for the final disposition of the deceased individual's human remains according to A.R.S. § § 36-831;
8. A person named in the deceased individual's last will and testament as the executor of the deceased individual's estate;
9. A person named in the deceased individual's last will and testament as a beneficiary of the deceased individual's estate;
10. A person named as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy on the deceased individual;
11. A person designated in a court order to receive a certified copy of the deceased individual's certificate of death registration;
12. A person authorized in writing to receive a certified copy of the deceased individual's certificate of death registration by a person who is eligible to receive a certified copy of the deceased individual's certificate of death registration according to subsection (B)(3), (4), (5), or (6);
13. An insurance company with which the deceased individual had a policy;
14. A bank, a credit union a mortgage lender, or another financial institution with which the deceased individual had an account or other business relationship;
15. A hospital or other health care institution processing a claim against the deceased individual's estate;
16. Another person having a claim against the deceased individual's estate;
17. An attorney representing a person who is eligible to receive a certified copy of the deceased individual's certificate of death registration;
18. The consulate of a foreign government representing a person who:
 - a. Is eligible to receive a certified copy of the deceased individual's certificate of death registration, according to subsection (B)(3), (4), or (5), or (6);
 - b. Is a citizen of the foreign country; and
 - c. Resides in the foreign country; and
19. A governmental agency processing a financial claim, a governmental benefit application, or another form of compensation on behalf of the deceased individual or the deceased individual's estate or having another official purpose for a certified copy of the deceased individual's certificate of death registration.

READ ME: Consulting a lawyer before filing documents with the court may help prevent unexpected results. A list of lawyers you may hire to advise you on handling your own case or to perform specific tasks, as well as a list of court-approved mediators can be found on the Law Library Resource Center website.

Request for court order to get a copy of a death certificate

This packet contains court forms and instructions to file a request for court order to get a copy of a death certificate. Items in **bold** are forms that you will need to file with the Court. Non-bold items are instructions or procedures. Do not copy or file those pages!

Instruction and Procedures: Request a court order to get a death certificate

Warning: Read all of these instructions in their entirety. Failure to follow these instructions may result in your case being delayed and, in some cases, denied.

STEP 1 Complete the Probate Cover Sheet and Petition.

STEP 2 Make two (2) copies of the Petition.

STEP 3 File the Probate Cover Sheet and provide all copies of the Petition to the Clerk of Superior Court.

- In Person or by mail.

The Clerk of Superior Court is open from 8:00a.m. – 5:00p.m., Monday-Friday. You should go at least two hours before closing time. The Clerk has filing counters at the following Superior Court locations:

Provide the Clerk with the originals and copies of your forms. The Clerk will stamp the copies and return them to you.

When mailing, you must include a self-addressed stamped envelope to return your copies to you.

Fees: When you file the documents, the Clerk of Superior Court will charge you certain fees that are required by Arizona law. You may pay those fees by cash, credit card, or money order. If you cannot afford the fees, you may request a deferral (payment plan) or waiver of the fees. Deferral and waiver applications are available at no charge from the Law Library Resource Center. A list of current fees is available from the Clerk of Superior Court's website.

STEP 4 Schedule a hearing. You may request a hearing in person or by phone.

To request a hearing in person, deliver one filed copy of the Petition to Probate Court Administration on the 1st floor of the Old Courthouse, 125 West Washington in Phoenix. Probate Court Administration will schedule a hearing and give you a Notice of Hearing.

To request a hearing by phone, wait at least 48 hours after filing your Petition before calling Probate Court Administration. Call (602) 506-5510 to schedule a hearing. Have your case number ready. Be prepared to provide your email address or confirm your mailing address so a Notice of Hearing can be sent to you.

STEP 5 Provide notice to those entitled to notice.

You must provide a copy of your Petition and the Notice of Hearing to the following:

1. Deceased person's spouse, AND
2. all their living parents, AND
3. all their living adult children.

If none of these persons are living, then you must provide a copy to all living adult siblings of the deceased.

Provide notice at least 14 calendar days before the hearing.

You may provide notice by mailing, hand delivery, or by process server or sheriff.

Once you have provided notice, complete the Proof of Notice of Hearing form and file it with the Clerk of Superior Court. Bring a filed copy of the Proof of Notice of Hearing to your hearing.

STEP 6 Prepare for the hearing.

Complete the caption information in the Order to Obtain Copy of Death Certificate. Bring the Order to your hearing or provide the Order to the court as directed by Probate Court Administration staff.

Note: If the court grants your request, you will need a certified copy of the Order to provide to the Office of Vital Registration. You can purchase a certified copy from the Clerk of Superior Court. To obtain one free-certified copy of your court order you will need to present your Judge-signed copy to the Clerk of Superior Court's filing counter within 48 hours after your hearing. If you need additional copies after that time, you will need to go to the Court's Customer Service Center at 601 W. Jackson Street in Phoenix.

Once you have your court order, you must contact the Maricopa County Office of Vital Registration to get a copy of the death certificate. There will be a fee. You may call (602) 506-6805 to schedule an appointment or get information about mail and online requests at <https://www.maricopa.gov/1012/Death-Certificates>.

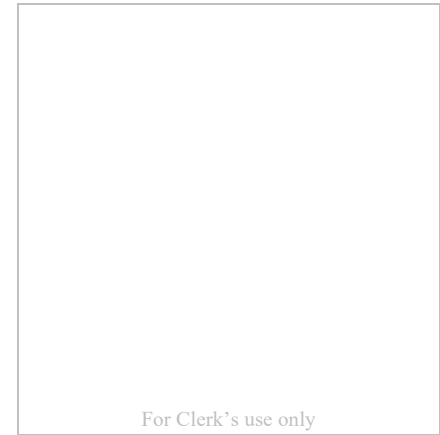
